Parents' Evening

Everybody should have received a letter yesterday about our upcoming **Parents' Evenings**, which will be held on Tuesday 27th & Wednesday 28th February. To ensure that you receive an appointment time on the day of your choice, it is important for all of these forms to be returned to school before Thursday. This will also enable us to send out all appointment times on Friday.

In addition to meeting with your child's class teacher and viewing some of your children's work, Miss Simcock will be running a **Scholastic Book Fair** in the school hall and staff from The Grange Academy will be present to discuss high school placements for children in upper Key Stage 2. *The Book Fair will be open from 3:10pm every day from Thursday 22nd February to Wednesday 28th February:*

Internet Safety Day

Today we celebrated Internet Safety Day. The day started with all of the children attending a morning assembly, led by Miss Whiting, which focused on how the children use technology and how to use it appropriately.



The children then learnt about what it means to be Internet Awesome – and what each class would be learning about throughout the remainder of the day. The children in each class will be sharing what makes them happy (and unhappy) when they are online in our Family Assembly on Friday; along with the key messages and mascots that they have created this week.

World Book Day – Thursday 1st March



Next Thursday is World Book Day. As has been the case in previous years, all of the children are invited to come to school, on this day, dressed as one of their favourite book characters and to bring into school their favourite book from home (to share with their friends).

During the day the children will take part in a variety of fun reading activities and be given the chance to see how all of the other children in school are dressed. This is always a very special day – and one that the children remember for a long time. It would be great if every child in our school took part.

Value of the Half Term – Self-Control

Every half term we choose a value that becomes the focus of our assemblies, discussions in class, some PSHE lessons and our 'You've Been Spotted' board. Since September we have focused on Caring, Trust and Kindness. Our 'new' value is Self Control.



This week the children will be learning and discussing what self-control means and encouraged to demonstrate this in school (as well as at home and when they are with their friends). Discussing when your child demonstrates good self-control at home – and setting them challenges to show greater self-control in certain situations (e.g. not getting angry when it's time to switch off the tv / electrical devices before they go to bed, speaking calmly when a sibling is trying to wind them up and not losing their temper) – would be a good way to reinforce what your child is learning in school.

It is also important for the children to remain positive, even when they face problems, challenges and work in school that they initially find difficult; and remaining in control so they give themselves the very best chance to succeed. It will be great to see the impact of our pupils showing greater self-control on their work, their friendships and how other children value and respect them.
