Face Coverings

Although COVID restrictions are currently being reviewed and relaxed nationwide, we are still requesting for all parents and visitors to our school to continue to wear face coverings when they come on to the school site (car park and playground) or line up along the pavement on Grangeway.



While the rate of infection in Halton is still relatively low, there is an upward trend at the moment and ALL staff who work in educational settings in Halton are now being offered vaccinations; to help limit the spread in the local community.

We have been advised that it is very likely that primary schools will still need to operate in bubbles in September (following the latest wave of coronavirus) and it would be great for this aspect of school life to be relaxed – if at all possible – at the start of the new academic year. This can only be achieved with significantly lower than national infection rates in Halton.

As a school, we will be continuing with our increased cleaning regime, staff wearing face masks in communal areas (and during hand over times at the start/end of the school day) AND continuing to promote regular hand washing and hand sanitising throughout the remainder of the Summer Term.

If we could have your support with the wearing of face coverings, it would be greatly appreciated.

At the club, which has the ECB [Clubmark](#) seal of approval, they have ECB qualified and DBS cleared male and female coaches (who will take the sessions and ensure the children are given the best quality coaching we can offer in a safe, friendly and fun environment). All the coaches are parent volunteers, whose children go to local schools in and around Runcorn, so they are attuned to children's and local communities needs and aspirations.
